PASTOR'S CORNER

Diagnosis Is One Thing...[a reprise from 2016]

The Ghost of Christmas Present produced from 'neath the hem of his robe two frighteningly emaciated, neglected children. Ebenezer asked, "What are they?" "They are your children," the ghost said, "they are the children of all of those who walk the world unseeing and unknowing. Their names are ignorance and want. Beware of them...for on their heads is written the word 'DOOM.'" Ebenezer Scrooge does not wish to see them any longer, and begs the spirit to "cover them."

We're all familiar with the Christmas conversion story of Mr. Scrooge by facing his own demons of greed, selfishness and selfrighteousness – not to mention facing his own mortality. His story is heartwarming and encouraging. But he is just one man; how does his conversion help with the ignorance and want of the world's inhabitants – an ignorance and want which is threatening innocent life in terrorism, violence and the horrors of abject poverty and inhumanity to man? The problems of the world, not to mention our own troubles, are too many and too large - what difference will it make if I am converted to Christ and his way of living more deeply than before, what improvement in the world is had in my efforts to act justly in my own personal affairs?

The diagnosis of the problems of the world is crucial. After all, one cannot treat a disease until one identifies its' symptoms and its' pathologies. But the diagnosis, while critical to get "just right," leads us to brainstorming some real solutions to the challenges at hand. And, no matter how broadsweeping our redresses to world problems and societies' faults and horrors, it all seems like a drop in the ocean – let alone how insignificant the repentance of my personal sins and horrors

seems to be up against the world's troubles. But then I remember what I've mentioned here before, and warrants repetition.

St. Teresa of Calcutta often talked of her work against the poverty and inhumanity of the poorest of the poor as a "drop of water in the ocean." "But," she always added, "the ocean would be less without that drop."

Don't get discouraged, friends, about the world's problems, just look them squarely in the eye and live your life with love and integrity. The cure of the disease of the world is in God's hands, not ours.

PILGRIM VIRGIN OF FATIMA

St. Augustine Zhao Rong and Companions

This group of 120 martyrs includes thirty-three European missionaries and eighty-seven Chinese, ranging in age from nine to seventy-six years of age. Their collective witness over three centuries is one of great courage and joy amid cruel tortures. Fourteen-year-old Anna Wang was the last of a group of women and children to be cut down by nationalist rebels, the Boxers, on July 22, 1900. Smiling, she faced the rebels: "The door of heaven is open to all! Jesus....Jesus....Jesus!" She was canonized with the other Chinese martyrs by Pope John Paul II on October 1, 2000, the feast of Saint Therese of Lisieux, patroness of the missions. "Magnificat, July, 2018

SAINT HENRY



The son of Duke Henry II and Princess Gisela of Burgundy, Saint Henry fought wars on all sides, including famously attacking the Christian Poles in alliance with the pagan Baltic tribes. Yet, after being

named Holy Roman Emperor in 1014, Henry displayed undisputed piety. He was openhanded to the poor and a fierce supporter of monasteries. On his way home from battles, he would visit pilgrimage sites. Thus it was that, returning home from an attack on the Greeks, he fell gravely ill at Saint Benedict's monastery at Monte Cassino in 1021. It is said that Benedict himself cured him. After his death in 1024, Henry was declared patron of Benedictine oblates.

ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA

Kateri Tekakwitha, the "Lily of the Mohawks," was born to a Mohawk father and a Christian Algonquin mother in the village of Ossernenon (upstate New York). Shortly after her baptism at the age of twenty, she moved to the Saint Francis Xavier mission near Montreal. It was said that she knew only two paths: to the chapel and to her work. She lived by the motto, "Who will teach me what is



most pleasing to God, that I may do it?" The Jesuit priests of the mission marveled at her deep prayer life, purity, and desire for mortification. She died at the age of twenty-four in 1680, and was canonized in 2012.
