WOMAN'S RETREAT WEEKEND



ST ANTHONY OF PADUA



Anthony began religious life as an Augustinian canon in his native Portugal. Moved by the witness of the first Franciscan martyrs, he joined the Friars Minor, hoping for martyrdom, but sickness prevented him. He was sent to a hermitage in Forlì, Italy, where he performed menial tasks. On one occasion, Anthony attended an ordination alongside Dominicans and fellow Franciscans. Confusion arose when it was time to preach, for no one had prepared a sermon. Anthony humbly stepped forward and delivered an address that stunned his listeners. Hearing of this, Saint Francis asked Anthony to instruct the brothers in theology. He preached throughout Italy and France. Anthony died in 1231 at the age of thirty-six. ~ *Magnificat June, 2017*

ST GERMAINE COUSIN



St. Germaine Cousin lived in Pibrac, France in the late 1500s. She was born with a deformed right arm and hand, as well as the disease of scrofula. Her stepmother was filled with disgust by Germaine's condition, and she was kicked out of the house and forced to sleep under the stairway in the barn. She tended to the family's flock of sheep every day. She spent much of her time praying the Rosary. She went to Mass every day. It was reported that on days when the river was high, the waters would part so that she could pass through to Mass. One day in winter, when she was being chased by her stepmother who accused her of stealing bread, she opened her apron and fresh summer flowers fell out. She offered the flowers to her stepmother as a sign of forgiveness. She died when she was 22 years old. Forty-three years later, Germaine's casket was opened and her body was found incorrupt.
