## SAINT PHILIP NERI



A native of Florence, Philip was ordained in Rome. He renewed the faith of the Romans through the ministry of the confessional and, later, the joyful meetings of the Oratory. The loose association of priests he founded to

support this work counts Blessed John Henry Newman among its members. Of Philip, Newman wrote, "Nothing was too high for him, nothing too low. He taught poor begging women to use mental prayer; he took out boys to play; he protected orphans... Cardinals hung about his room, and popes asked for his miraculous aid in disease... It was his mission to save people, not from, but in, the world." Philip died in 1595.

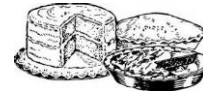
