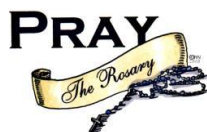

# PASTOR’S CORNER

## The Limits of Speech

This week’s *immoral* remarks by Roseanne Barr and Samantha Bee have many people wandering about the limits (?) of free speech in a civil society. Many argue that the whole idea of free speech is especially to be defended when the speech in question offends someone, while many others point to the “you can’t yell fire in a crowded theater (if there is no fire)” due to the danger to people’s lives during a panic. So the debate can continue and will continue here in America. But for a disciple of Jesus, the debate about morality in speech was settled long before the USA ever existed.

We start with the Commandments, especially numbers two, five, seven and eight. Here, the Lord underlines the importance of the reverent use of our ability to speak toward Himself and people whose lives should be respected, whose reputations should be guarded, whose rights to hear the truth from us are constrained only by their right to know. Jesus, in the Gospel, goes further saying these haunting words, “I tell you, on the day of judgment people will render an account for every careless word they speak. By your words you will be acquitted, and by your words you will be condemned.” [Matthew 2:36-37.] And, “Let your ‘Yes’ mean ‘Yes,’ and your ‘No’ mean ‘No.’ Anything more is from the evil one.” [Matthew 5:37.] And St. James writes in his letter to believers, “If anyone thinks he is religious and does not bridle his tongue<sup>z</sup> but deceives his heart, his religion is vain.” James further underscores the importance of moral speech (self-control) in the entire third chapter of his letter – I recommend a complete read of James chapter 3 at least once a year.

With all the dishonesty, mixed messages, fake news, and “real” news (which seldom

acknowledges its' own biases) these days, it is up to us to make our family units and households "places" of moral speech, reverence and constant desire for the truth, and which honors the Holy Name of Jesus.

Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us!

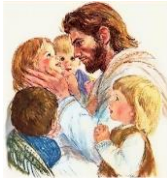
